ASSUMED NAME

Individuals starting a business in the County using a name for the business other than their given name are required by Illinois State Statute to register their business name. This process is completed through the County Clerk's office. The process is as follows:

- 1. Fill out the Assumed Name Certificate of Intention (see below). The form must be signed by the owner(s) in front of a notary.
- 2. Provide the completed form and the appropriate fee to the County Clerk's office. The current fee may be found on this website.
- 3. The County Clerk will complete a Public Notice form for the owner(s) to take to the Greenville Advocate. The Advocate will publish the notice once a week for three consecutive weeks. The Advocate will provide the owner(s) a Certificate of Publication.
- 4. Bring the Certificate of Publication back to the County Clerk. The Clerk will then issue a "Certificate of Business Registration" to the owner(s).
