

The Board appointed Natalie Miller to the Board of Health for the remainder of Rebecca Nehrt's term, being June 30, 2027 with a motion made by Jeff Rehkemper and seconded by Wes Pourchot. Roll Call Vote: 5 ayes and 0 nays; the motion carried.

The Board announced 3 openings on the Bond County Board of Health with Matt McCullough, Carrie Ackerman, and Krista Hamilton recommended reappointment to the board of health for the term 07/01/2026-06/30/2029.

The Board approved the Election Judges to be Submitted to the Court with a motion made by Jeff Rehkemper second by Jacob Rayl. Roll Call Vote: 5 ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.

The Board approved Liquor License for Copper Dock LLC, Farm Heritage Museum, and Nuby's Steakhouse with a motion made by Jeff Rehkemper and second by Wes Pourchot. Roll Call Vote: 5 ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.

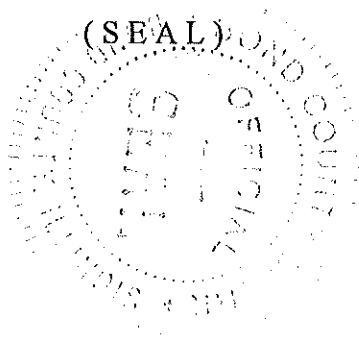
There was no Old Business.

There was no New Business.

Discussion was held regarding the development of a strategic plan for the County's buildings. It was recognized that the jail and main courthouse have several ongoing issues and continue to place a significant demand on County resources. Jeff Rehkemper stated that a group had toured the Southwestern Electric building. He noted that there could be several efficiencies in consolidating County offices into one building, including shared utilities and related operational savings. However, it remains unclear whether the Southwestern Electric building could accommodate all County offices. Sheriff Josh Hill requested that an engineering firm be hired to evaluate both the Southwestern Electric building and the option of constructing a new building, and to provide cost estimates for each. Zoning Administrator Brad Criner stated that he has been working with SWIPC to arrange a meeting with the Mayor of Columbia, Illinois, whose community recently constructed a new facility. SWIPC is also making recommendations for engineering firms. Circuit Clerk Randi Workman requested that the engineering firm also evaluate the condition of the County's current buildings and provide cost estimates for necessary repairs. State's Attorney Dora Mann confirmed that payment for the engineering firm could properly be made by the Public Building Commission. It was determined that a committee should be formed to work on this project. Both the selection of an engineering firm and the formation of the committee will be placed on the next County Board agenda for approval.

This meeting adjourned at 4:31 p.m. with a motion made by Wes Pourchot second by Jeff Rehkemper. Roll Call Vote: 5 ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.
