Proceedings had before the Honorable Board at the regular meeting of said Board, begun and held in person and via Video Conference in the City of Greenville in said County and State, on Tuesday, July 5, 2022, held for the transaction of general County business.

At 9:00 a.m., Chairman, Adam Boudouris, opened the meeting by leading the Pledge of Allegiance. Roll Call showing a quorum present as follows: Adam Boudouris, Jacob Rayl, Joseph Whalen, Gerald McCray and Wes Pourchot.

The minutes of the June 21, 2022, regular meeting were approved as submitted with a motion made by Wes Pourchot second by Gerald McCray. Roll Call Vote: 5 ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.

The bills listed on Edit Report dated June 30, 2022 (see attached) were approved as submitted with a motion made by Gerald McCray second by Jacob Rayl. Roll Call Vote: 5 ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.

Zoning Administrator Brad Criner gave the Board his June 2022 report which included permits, inspections and revenues (see attached).

Adam Boudouris informed the Board that the Highway Engineer Jeremy Pestle is still looking for a new employee and will be taking resumes soon.

The Board approved a Liquor License for HWY 127 Saloon with a motion made by Gerald McCray and second by Joseph Whalen. Roll Call Vote: 5 ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.

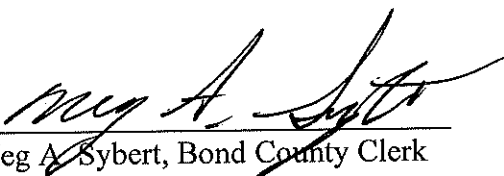
Treasurer Colleen Camp updated the Board regarding the ARPA expiditures (see attached). Funds need to be committed by 2024 and spent by 2026. The County has received the second installment of ARPA funds.

The Board discussed a 3% salary increase for the Animal Control Officer Jim Hess. County Clerk Meg Sybert informed the Board that Jim did not take an increase for the years 2020 and 2021. The increase is budgeted and half would be covered by the City of Greenville. The Board approved this increase with a motion made by Joseph Whalen second by Jacob Rayl. Roll Call Vote: 5 ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.

A request to use the Courthouse Lawn for a peaceful gathering protesting the Supreme Court's decision on Roe v. Wade on July 8th was approved with the time being amended to 4:30 p.m. instead of 4 p.m. in order to not disrupt Courthouse business hours with a motion made by Wes Pourchot second by Joseph Whalen. Roll Call Vote: 5 ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.

Under Old Business, Jacob Rayl informed the Board that the awards phase of the Broadband Committee Survey has ended but the survey is still open to collect data. Brad Criner informed the Board that they had a 10% response Countywide, which the committee was happy to see.

This meeting adjourned at 9:11 a.m. with a motion made by Gerald McCray second by Wes Pourchot. Roll Call Vote: 5 ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.
