

Bond County 377 Board levy request was presented.

Bill Schmaltz, President & CEO of ECG spoke on ECG Health Insurance offerings, addressing pros and cons versus the current health insurance plan with HopeTrust. Bill addressed any questions or concerns of the employees that were present.

After discussion, it was decided to table the approval of the 2026 Countywide Health Insurance Plan until the special meeting August 26, 2025 with a motion made by Wes Pourchot second by Jacob Rayl. Roll Call Vote: 5 ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.

The Board approved use of the Courthouse lawn requested by Mia Emken for Hope Fest, benefitting the Restore Network and Core Community on April 11, 2026 and Come Home for Christmas on November 29, 2025 with a motion made by Jeff Rehkemper second by Wes Pourchot. Roll Call Vote: 5 ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.

The Board approved the Sheriff's July 2025 Report with a motion made by Jeff Rehkemper second by Wes Pourchot. Roll Call Vote: 5 ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.

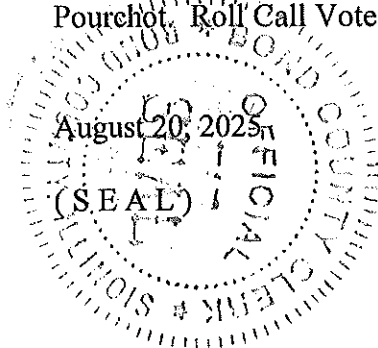
The Board announced 3 Bond County Governing Board Appointee openings for the Bond County Extension Board with Sue Backs, Wes Pourchot, and Jan Woker being recommended for re-appointment.


The Board approved the Animal Control's July 2025 Report with a motion made by Jeff Rehkemper second by Wes Pourchot. Roll Call Vote: 5 ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.

Under Old Business, Jeff Rehkemper raised concerns about PrideFest. He expressed his disagreement with some of the events scheduled to take place on the Courthouse lawn. Chris Timmermann read the email requesting permission to use the Courthouse lawn, noting that those events were not disclosed in the email, which may have influenced the initial vote. Rehkemper has requested that the approval for PrideFest's use of the Courthouse lawn be revisited
